

Access-level switches



Article Overview

Access-level switches are network edge devices that connect end-user devices to the broader network, providing port density, PoE, VLAN management, and security controls.

Role in Network Architecture

Access switches operate at the access layer of a hierarchical network, which typically consists of three layers: core, distribution, and access . They serve as the first point of connection for end-user devices such as computers, IP phones, wireless access points, cameras, and IoT devices . Unlike core or distribution switches, access switches focus on port density, user connectivity, and local traffic forwarding, rather than high-speed backbone routing .

Key Functions

- **Device Connectivity:** Connects end devices to the network and forwards traffic upstream to distribution or core switches .
- **Power over Ethernet (PoE):** Supplies power to devices like IP phones and cameras directly through network cables .
- **VLAN Management:** Segments network traffic for security and efficiency, ensuring devices are placed in the correct VLANs .
- **Traffic Forwarding:** Handles local traffic efficiently, often performing Layer 2 switching based on MAC addresses. Layer 3 access switches can also perform inter-VLAN routing and IP-based forwarding .
- **Security Controls:** Implements access policies, including port security, ACLs, and u...
