

Can signal cables be run through low-voltage cable trays

Article Overview

Signal cables can be run through low-voltage cable trays, but they should be separated from high-power cables to prevent electromagnetic interference (EMI) and comply with NEC standards.

NEC Compliance and Cable Tray Use

Cable trays are approved for supporting service conductors, feeders, branch circuits, communications circuits, control circuits, and signaling circuits in industrial and commercial installations . Low-voltage signal cables, such as instrumentation, control, or data lines, can be installed in trays designed for low-power applications. However, mixing high-power and low-power cables in the same tray is generally discouraged unless a solid divider or sufficient physical separation is provided to prevent EMI .

Best Practices for Signal Cable Installation

- **Dedicated trays:** Use separate trays for signal and power cables whenever possible to maintain signal integrity .
- **Tray types:** Ladder trays provide good ventilation for larger cables, while solid-bottom trays protect delicate signal cables from dust, moisture, and EMI .
- **Shielding and spacing:** If signal and power cables must share a tray, maintain adequate spacing and consider shielded cables to reduce interference .
- **Future growth:** Plan trays with extra capacity to accommodate additional signal cables without overcrowding, which can cause mechanical stress and maintenance...
