Hot-Pluggable Capability

Optical modules are designed to be hot-pluggable, meaning they can be safely inserted into or removed from a compatible port while the device is powered on . This feature is common in SFP, SFP+, QSFP, and other small form-factor pluggable modules, which are widely used in data centers, Ethernet networks, and storage networks . Hot-pluggability allows network upgrades, replacements, or maintenance without interrupting system operation.

Safe Plugging and Unplugging Procedures

- Insertion: Align the module with the port and insert it horizontally until it clicks into place. For SFP modules, ensure the pull-tab or locking mechanism engages properly .
- Removal: First, unplug the fiber cable connected to the module. Then, flip or pull the module's release tab and gently pull it out horizontally. Forcing the module without releasing the locking mechanism can damage the module or the host port .
- Precautions: Always wear an anti-static wristband or ensure proper grounding to prevent electrostatic discharge, which can damage the module or port . Keep dust caps on unused modules to prevent contamination of the optical interface .
