

Does the grounding busbar of the distribution box need to be grounded



Overview

The busbar trunking system must have grounding terminals at both the start and end, with grounding markings at these terminals. The grounding electrode conductor connection to the neutral conductor at service equipment must be made at any accessible point from the load end of the overhead service conductors, service drop, underground service conductors, or service lateral to the terminal or bus to which the service neutral. Ground and neutral can be connected to the same bus bar only at the main service entrance or at the first means of disconnect in a system. At the terminal stations where cables transition to overhead lines in systems of. Power from factory ground must be installed by a qualified electrician. Each DISTRIBUTION BOX and controller must be grounded.
