

How far apart should a cable tray be with one support

Article Overview

Cable tray supports should generally be spaced 4 to 6 feet apart for horizontal runs, with a maximum of 5 feet according to NEC guidelines.

Recommended Support Intervals

For most cable tray installations, the National Electrical Code (NEC) specifies that supports must be installed at intervals recommended by the tray manufacturer, but not exceeding 5 feet for horizontal runs to safely support the weight of cables and any additional loads such as wind or seismic forces (Zexin Electrical) . Ideally, the run length between supports should be uniform and fall within 4 to 6 feet to prevent sagging and uneven stress on the tray . Ladder-type trays have rungs spaced no more than 9 inches apart to maintain structural integrity .

Factors Affecting Support Spacing

- Tray Type: Solid-bottom, perforated, or wire mesh trays may have slightly different support requirements. Perforated trays require careful leveling to avoid uneven stress .
- Cable Load: Heavier cables or bundles may require closer support spacing to prevent sagging or mechanical strain .
- Environmental Conditions: Outdoor installations exposed to wind, ice, or seismic activity may need additional supports .
- Installation Orientation: Vertical runs or angled sections may require different spa...
