Fiber optic cable may be installed indoors or outdoors using several different installation processes. Outdoor cable may be direct buried, pulled or blown into conduit or innerduct, or installed aerially between poles. Indoor cables can be installed in raceways, cable trays above ceilings or under. A conduit is a protective tube or channel that houses the fiber optic cables, shielding them from moisture, dust, physical stress, and other environmental factors.
