A 30-core optical fiber cable can be custom ordered to any required length, typically with a recommended 10% safety buffer, and the maximum practical length depends on fiber type and application.

Standard and Custom Lengths

Optical fiber cables, including 30-core configurations, are often custom cut to match the required cable run or ordered in reels that can be cut on-site . Standard practice is to add an extra 10% length to account for installation variations, routing around obstacles, and future adjustments . This ensures that the cable can reach termination points without tension or splicing issues.

Factors Affecting Maximum Length

- Fiber Type:
 - Single-mode fibers (OS2) are ideal for long-distance applications and can transmit signals over several kilometers without amplification .
 - Multimode fibers (OM1, OM2, OM3, OM4) are typically used for shorter runs, generally under 550 meters for high-speed networks, with distances decreasing as data rates increase .
- Attenuation and Dispersion: Signal loss (attenuation) and chromatic dispersion limit the effective transmission distance. Single-mode fibers have lower attenuation and can support longer runs, while multimode fibers experience higher signal loss over distance .
- Installation Environment: Indoor, outdoor, or armored cables may have different h...
